Deputy Reeve Negropontes opened the public hearing regarding Bylaw #LU 62/10.

ADOPTED

The application for redesignation of the NE 32-31-3-W5M Plan 0413796 Block 1 Lot 1 was introduced by the Planning and Development Department and the following information was introduced as provided in the agenda package such as the application for redesignation, location map, assessment map, site map, and aerial photos. The Planning and Development Department provided specific information to the application as follows:

Michael Mestoros, applicant, stated that the proposal meets the setback requirements from the pipelines. He discussed the concerns of Mr. Eggins and stated that sewer disposal would be dealt with in accordance with regulations for the sewage disposal, Confined Feeding Operations and manure spreading would not be a concern since the spreading of manure only happens on occasion. Soil samples are taken to ensure that the ground does not become contaminated with over fertilizing.

Deputy Reeve Negropontes asked if there were any comments from the gallery. No one came forward.

- Currently no dwelling unit on parcel
- Applicant owns four acres
- Can have two dwellings, second has to be manufactured with limit to size.
- Concept Plan has to reflect what Council wants to achieve for the area.
- Forty acres already existing
- The area is not designated as environmentally sensitive
- There is a possibility of four homes with proposal
- Disturbed area is not in a low area, there was a hill that was leveled out.

Deputy Reeve Negropontes asked if there were any comments from the gallery.

Rolf Eggins, adjacent landowner, stated that the draw area and land disturbance has affected the area and that his dugout is empty. The draw area does collect water from the rest of the quarter and does flow through that ground disturbance.

- Water supply or quality is not a concern
- The access does not cause traffic safety issues as it is not off the County Connector Network
- The Confined Feeding Operation to the north is not registered but is a significant livestock operation
- There is the potential for 2 dwellings plus secondary suite without the cluster
- Groundwater interference is concern.

Deputy Reeve Negropontes asked if there were any comments from the gallery. No one came forward.

Sharon Holmes stated there are so many clusters that the area is turning into a village.

The applicant was provided the opportunity for closing remarks and stated the guidelines are being met.

The Planning and Development Department was provided the opportunity for closing remarks and recommended that the access be approved as proposed as access should come off the gravel road to address safety concerns.
