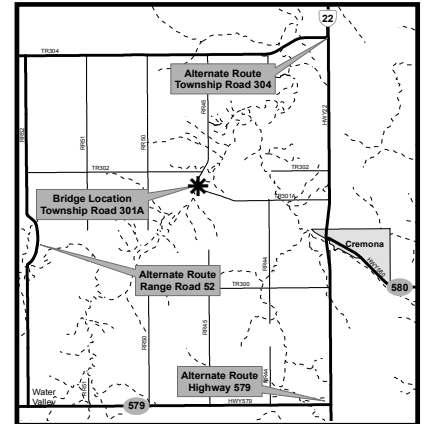
The Big Prairie Bridge is closed indefinitely

The bridge located on Twp. Rd 301A, the Big Prairie Road, two miles west of Highway 22, has been closed indefinitely due to fire destroying the bridge structure.

Signage and barricades have been erected Southbound on Range Road 45 at Shell Burnt Timber Road Twp 304; East and West of the Bridge on Twp. Rd. 301A and at Water Valley north bound on Range Road 52.

Local traffic will still be permitted to access their residences along affected portions of Twp 301A.

Motorists looking to travel east or westbound on the Big Prairie Road are asked to use alternate routes.



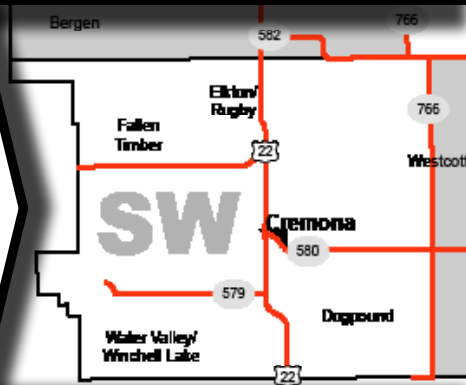
