

How to Read Your Assessment / Tax Notice

Front Page

The front page of your notice is a summary of all the properties you own in Mountain View County, with a break down of where your tax dollars will be allocated. The front page also includes information on the optional monthly payment plan. If you are interested in signing up for the monthly payment plan, please fill out the form that is included in the notice mail out.

Second Page

The second page of the notice contains a detailed assessment break down of each of the properties you own. This page also contains information on school support, Rural Assessment Policy, and County tax rates.

If you have any questions or concerns when you receive your Assessment / Tax notice, an Assessor would be happy to answer any questions or concerns you may have. You can contact Assessment by stopping by the County office, calling the Assessment department at 403-335-3311; or visit www.mountainviewcounty.com/assessment for more information.

Assessment / Tax notices were mailed out on May 15.

Taxes are due on or before September 15th

Your taxes are based on the assessed value of your property. The assessed value of your residential property is based on the most probable selling price of your property as of July 1st, 2008.

It pays to keep your waste plastic until Spring, 2009

Mountain View Regional Waste Management Commission is **always** accepting net wrap, tarps, twine and silage plastic at the Olds Transfer Station. Mountain View County residents who wait until Spring, 2009 to deliver a minimum of 100 kgs of waste plastic for recycling will receive \$100 to keep, or donate to a 4H Club of their choice.

Dates eligible for Incentive for Farm Plastic: → April 20–June 20 (M-Tu-W each week)
→ Specials Saturdays: May 2, May 23, June 20
(Limit of one payment per farm. Mountain View County residents only)

If you're planning to recycle waste plastics, please remember:

- Upon delivery, twine and net wrap must be bagged in either plastic mini bulk bags; or large plastic bags- no straw or loose hay- and tied off.
- Black tarps, silage tarps, and poly need to be in 3'x3' bundles-tied and secured-able to handle.
- MVRWMC has the right to charge for any plastics that we deem unacceptable. The charges are \$130.00/ tonne at the transfer site; or \$90.00/ tonne at the landfill.
- Silage plastic and tarps must be clean (no large frozen lumps or clumps of silage).

Please note- Please call the Waste Transfer Station at 403-556-8120 before coming to pick clear plastic bags, to ensure there are some available.

We'll pay you to recycle wire!

Mountain View Regional Waste Management Commission, in conjunction with Mountain View County, will be collecting barbed and strand wire to be recycled:

When- From 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekdays

Where- Didsbury Landfill (two miles north of Didsbury, off of Range Road 20 and Twp. Rd. 314)

Be sure to come early- Mountain View County's Agricultural Service Board farmers will pay the recycling costs on the first 50 tonnes of wire delivered by Mountain View County residents.

If you plan to take part, please note:

- Barbed and strand wire must be rolled as tightly as possible.
- Wire must be free of debris (dirt, sod, posts, etc.)
- Once the first 50 tonnes of wire has been delivered, the cost of disposal is 10 cents per kilogram


