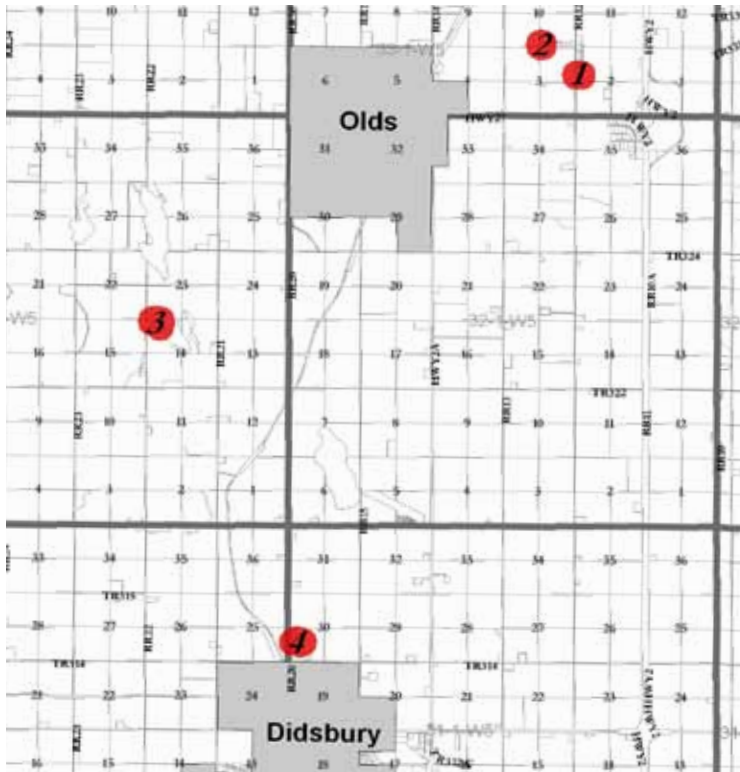


## Notice of Public Hearings

Mountain View County Council is holding public hearings to determine the best use of the following four Municipal Reserve properties:

1. Lot 2MR NW-2-33-1-W5M
2. Lot 11MR SE-10-33-1-W5M
3. Lot 6MR NW-14-32-2-W5M
4. Lot 1MR SW-30-31-1-W5M



Mountain View County is considering disposing of these Municipal Reserve properties. Prior to passing a resolution changing the use of the properties, Council must hold a Public Hearing to receive public input into the decision.

If the Municipal Reserve Designation is removed, a title change can be requested through Land Titles. The property then becomes fee simple property that Mountain View County could dispose of in accordance with our land disposal policy and the Municipal Government Act. The proceeds from sale of reserve land would need to be transferred to the Cash in Lieu Reserve and can only be used for Cash in Lieu eligible expenditures.

The public hearings are scheduled for **October 26, 2011** at or after **9 a.m.**

## Proper Bale Storage

With haying season in full swing, Mountain View County wants to remind producers of property setbacks when it comes to storing hay bales.

Under the Land Use Bylaw 10/10, Section 4.2, the minimum setback for hay bale storage is 15 metres from any property line. As well, storage of hay in County right-of-ways is prohibited without written permission.

Improperly stored hay bales can lead to unnecessary snow drifts forming on roads, causing increased costs and time for snow clearing. Additionally bales in right-of-ways can pose a visual and driving hazard both in terms of drifting snow during winter and line of sight year-round.

## Notice of road sign change

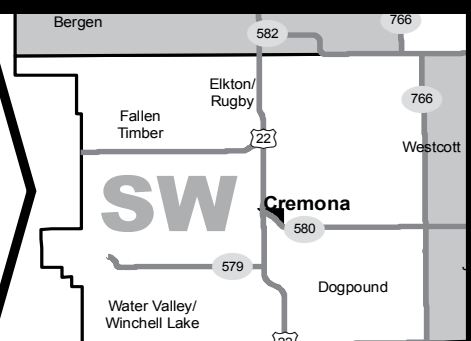
